
Activities/Accomplishments. Known to its legion of friends and patrons as The Golf Capital Chorus, the Pinehurst chapter of the Carolinas District enjoyed a highly successful year in 2012. The year began with Robert Cox agreeing to become the director of our chorus. He grew up learning to play the tenor saxophone. However as a music education major at East Carolina University, he abandoned the sax as he discovered a passion for choral singing. He comments, "In college became a member of every group. Concert Choir, Opera Theater, the Madrigal Singers, everything except the Women's Glee Club." In his new role as our director he brings vast experiences as a director in several areas of the state including Raleigh and Wilmington. In addition to his new position he continues to direct the Barbershop chorus in Winston Salem as well as "The Masters Men," a 21 member ensemble which specializes in singing spiritual music. Finally, he acts as a vocal coach for several well known barbershop quartets. His numerous teaching strategies and vocalizing techniques have already significantly improved the quality of our singing. His dead-on impersonation of Jack Benny lets us know when we have done something less than he expects.

In February 12, 13, and 14 several chapter quartets delivered a near record number of "Singing Valentines." As we have for several years, we obtained donations from several sponsors which enabled us to offer "free valentines" to the families of deployed members of the armed forces in the Fort Bragg area. This is always one of our most rewarding as well as hectic activities. In 2012 we added over \$ 2,000 to our treasury as a result of our heartfelt efforts. Throughout the year the chorus sings at least once each month at local nursing homes and

assisted living facilities. Chapter quartets receive requests to offer paid performances at private events on an average of at least once a week

While we have begun to sing in competition since the creation of the Carolinas District and were named the most improved chorus in 2011, donating money to charities has been our primary goal since our founding in 1981. As with most chapters, our annual show on the first Saturday in November, is our major fund raising event. In 2012 past district president Bob "Squeak" Tilton, served as show chairman as we presented, "A Salute To Those Who Served." Our guest quartet was 2011 District Champion "Lets Sing." We set a record by selling \$32,650.00 in advertisements for the show program.

Since we live in the golf capital of the world, most of us play golf and many of us live on golf courses. This means we often find gently used golf balls in our yards. One of our members reconditions them sells them to local golf stores or back to us at bargain basement prices. For 2012 these sales raised \$ 2,500.00. All our fund raising ventures enabled us to achieve another record by donating \$26,250.00 to charity. This means that since our founding we have donated a total of \$ 324,873.00 to charity.

Fall District Contest - Oct 28


