Spring Convention and Contests

Charlotte, NC March 20-21, 2015

Once again Quartet and Chorus International Prelims were held at the Spring Convention and Contests. Twenty-three quartets competed in six contests:

- International Prelim (2 rounds): For the first time the Carolinas District qualified two quartets for the International Quartet Contest, held in July 2015 in Pittsburgh, PA: *Let's Sing!* with an average score of 78.0 and *Zero Hour*, with an average score of 77.6
- District Qualifier (1 round): quartets qualifying for the Carolinas District Quartet Contest at the 2015 Fall Festival were: Tucker Street, Riverside Ringers, Bar None, Harmony Grits, Final Countdown, Supersonic, Midtown, Shrimp 'n Grits, Infinity, and Quartet X.
- Senior International Prelim (1 round): *Harmony Grits*, with a score of 68.8, qualified to represent the Carolinas District at the International Seniors Quartet Contest, at the Mid-Winter Convention in Reno, NV in Jan. 2015. (Subsequently, **Final Countdown** qualified for an at-large bid.)
- Senior District (1 round): **Final Countdown**, with a score of 68.8, were the Carolinas District 2015 District Seniors Quartet Champion.
- Novice Quartet (1 round): *The Young Ones,* with an average score of 63.7, were the Carolinas District 2015 District Novice Quartet Champion.
- Collegiate (1 round): *Riverside Ringers*, qualified to present the Carolinas District at the Harmony Foundation Collegiate Quartet Contest in Pittsburgh, PA, July 2015. (Note: there was no 2015 Collegiate Quartet Champion since the *Riverside Ringers* were the 2014 Carolinas District Collegiate Champion in and no other collegiate quartets competed.



The chorus contest was held Saturday Mar. 21 with thirteen choruses competing. Here are the results:

- International Chorus Prelims: *Carolina Vocal Express* (Greater Gaston), will represent the Carolinas District in Nashville, TN July 2016. CVE, directed by Ben Mills, had 88 men on stage, and scored a 79.6.
- 2015 Carolinas District Chorus Champion and Plateau AA Champion: *Heart of Carolina Chorus* (Central Carolina) directed by Dr. Bill Adam with 22 men on stage and a score of 71.2.
- The next choruses in the top 5 were: *Gold Standard Chorus* (Charlotte, 28 men, directed by Larry Lane), *General Assembly* (Research Triangle Park, 29 men, directed by Bill Rashleigh), and *Triad Harmony Express* (Winston-Salem, 20 men, directed by Robert Cox).
- Plateau A Champion: Tarheel Chorus (Greensboro), 18 men, directed by John Peeler.
- Plateau AAA Champion: Palmetto Statesmen (Spartanburg), 37 men, directed by Dan Seaman.
- Most Improved Chorus: Golf Capital Chorus (Pinehurst), 31 men, directed by Robert Cox.

Chorus awards were presented by George Joslin, Contest Administrator, and Larry Reinhart, VP Contest and Judging.

The Spring Convention also featured Harmony Platoon. (See The Year in Review for a history of Platoon events) Singing in a quartet is the ultimate barbershop harmony experience and Platoon provides an opportunity to do some quarteting with like-minded guys within the District. Each participant learned four "medium difficulty" songs in advance. There were three separate contests: Thursday 6 pm; Friday at 10 am and 2 pm. Just before each contest everyone met as a group and sang the songs thru a couple of times before making the quartet draw. After the drawing for quartet-mates and the song to sing the quartet had about 20 minutes to rehearse before coming back to sing for the other Platooners. The Harmony Platoon Quartet Champion quartet was formed with the highest scoring singer on each part (averaged over the number of contests/scores he receives). On Friday and Saturday evenings after the contests the Platoon Hospitality Room was available to continue singing songs, tags, and host the competing quartets.
